

Instruction Sheet: Four Classical Family Drawing Tests

Hulse's Draw-A-Family test (DAF)

Instruction: "Draw your family."

Tools: a No. 2 pencil and a sheet of 8.5" x 11" paper

Author: Wilfred C. Hulse (1951, 1952)

Corman's Family Drawing (FD)

Instruction: "Draw a family (like you imagine it)"

Tools: a sheet of white paper (the size is not specified) and a sharpened so pencil or coloured pencils

Author: Louis Corman (1964, 1965, 1967a, b)

Animal Family Drawing (AFD)

Instruction: "Draw your family as animals."

Tools: a No. 2 pencil and a sheet of 8.5" x 11" paper

Author: Luitgart Brem-Gräser (1957)

Enchanted family drawing

Instruction: (brief version) "Imagine that a wizard turns everyone in your family into something else. Draw what they are all turned into!"

Tools: a No. 2 pencil and a sheet of 8.5" x 11" paper
